Statement of Purpose

IN JUNE 1967 jet aircraft and motor torpedo boats of the Defense Forces of the State of Israel brutally assaulted the American naval intelligence-gathering ship, *USS Liberty*, while in international waters off the coast of the Sinai Peninsula in the Mediterranean Sea. The attack was preceded by more than six hours of intense low-level surveillance by Israeli photo reconnaissance aircraft, which buzzed the ship as low as 200 feet directly overhead. The carefully orchestrated assault that followed was initiated by high performance jet aircraft. This was followed by slower and more maneuverable jets carrying napalm, and was finally turned over to lethal torpedo boats, which blasted a forty-foot hole in the ship's side. The attack lasted more than two hours, deliberately killing 34 Americans and wounding at least 171 others. Over 821 rocket, cannon and machine gun holes were inflicted. When the *Liberty* stubbornly remained afloat despite her damage, Israeli forces machine-gunned her life rafts, firefighters, stretcher bearers, and sent helicopters carrying troops to finish the job, no survivors were to be taken.



At this point, with Sixth Fleet rescue aircraft supposedly en route, the government of Israel apologized and the identity of the assailants became known.

Details of the attack were hushed up in both countries. Israel claimed that her forces mistook the *Liberty* for an Egyptian ship, and our government quietly accepted that excuse despite evidence to the contrary. No ship in our history has ever received such damage and casualties by accident. Then our government downplayed the intensity of the surveillance and the severity of the attack, and imposed a news blackout on the crew to keep the story under control. The official version is that the *Liberty* was reconnoitered only three times and only from a great distance. The American people were told that the air attack lasted only five minutes and that it was followed by a single torpedo and an immediate apology and offer of assistance. Nothing could be further from the truth. In June 1982, fifteen years after the assault, crewmembers reunited for the first time in Washington, D.C. It was a tearful, joyful reunion in which the men not only released their pent up emotions and decided that the **USS Liberty Veterans Association** would be formed with the firm goals of finding all crew members, holding reunions, proper recognition of Captain and crew (in particular those who lost their lives), obtaining a Congressional investigation into the attack, and...

I will remember that fateful day of Thursday, 8 June, 1967. At the time I was a LTjg aboard the USS Saratoga serving one of Air Wing 3's squadrons, VA-176. I was their Air Intelligence Officer at that moment.

I have put off preparing a presentation regarding the attack upon the Liberty for decades. I am now nearly 81 and can no longer assume I will have the mental or physical ability to do justice when relating what happened to you and your shipmates on that awful day.

I have read four books: James M. Ennes' Assault on the Liberty, Robert J. Allen's Beyond Treason, Phillip F. Nelson's Remember the Liberty, and James Scott's Attack on the Liberty. And yes, even apologist A. Jay Cristol's book should arrive soon. Large amounts of internet sources are also a part of my preparation. In fact, there is so much data it has become quite a challenge to boil it all down to a meaningful and hopefully honest and balanced accounting for an audience.

The audience will be in our community club house which can seat up to 140 persons. How many will respond to my future announcement is unknown.

That the governments of the United States of America and the State of Israel have colluded in a cover up of precisely what took place and why disgusts me.

If you choose, please extend my best wishes to all of your shipmates.

Letter from Robert J. Michael

Why is U.S. foreign policy predicated upon the use of military force and economic sanctions? Is it our need to create a hegemonic world fashioned upon American exceptionalism, our belief that our brand of government and economic system should be the model for all nations?

Or are we so lacking in self-assurance that we subliminally harbor an inferiority complex pushing us to make other nations follow our diktats?

Reduced to simplistic terms, we have become the “bully” of the world. With almost 800 military facilities, troops in 130 nations, and active in several wars around the globe, we fit the definition.

As big a bully that we are, one small nation has kicked us in the shins and brought us to our knees on a few occasions. That country is Israel.

The first time was on June 8, 1967 when Israel deliberately attacked the USS Liberty, a US naval intelligence ship operating in international waters. Israel killed 34 American sailors and marines, injured 174 others, and ultimately sent the liberty to the scrap heap. The American and Israeli governments covered up Israel's deliberate attack, with president Johnson twice calling back American jets that were dispatched to defend the ship during the attack. Johnson chose to let Americans die, rather than “to embarrass our ally”, Israel. From that moment on, the United States has been wallowing in Israel's muddy hands. Israel knows that at any time, they can kick us in the shins, bring us to our knees, and shove our face into the mud. As a desperate reaction to our humiliation and denigration by Israel, we act tough with the rest of the world. But Israel laughs at us because they know that it is a dog and pony show for us.

Time for the US Government to come clean. Admit that the USS Liberty was intentionally attacked by Israel; admit that we covered it up; admit that we left the liberty to be pummeled by Israel; apologize to the USS Liberty crew; recompense the crew and their heirs for their pain and suffering, anguish, medical bills, for threatening them with injury and death if they spoke about the Israeli attack; and pay them at least \$56 million per man (or heirs) for denying them their basic human rights since 08 Jun 1967, and beg the American people for forgiveness for lying to us and for perpetuating a fraud for more than 56 years.

Once the US Government removes these shackles from its inferiority complex, let us adopt a new foreign policy, one that promotes peace, not war.

The Passing of Ron Schneider

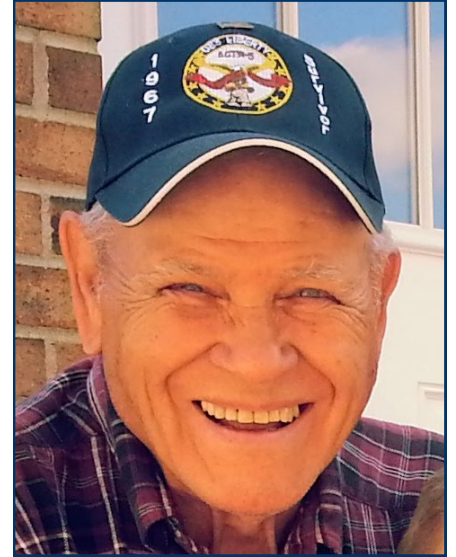

Rick also leaves behind a vast network of extended friends from the Currituck, North Carolina Community, the St. Katharine Drexel Church, and the United States Navy.

Originally from Brooklyn NY, Rick joined the US Navy in 1954, where he served faithfully and honorably for 30 years, retiring as a Master Chief Machinist's Mate, after circumnavigating the globe multiple times. Throughout his career Rick distinguished himself as a Sailor, Shipmate, and Mentor.

Master Chief Machinist's Mate Brooks was presented with the Silver Star for conspicuous gallantry and intrepidity in connection with the unprovoked and unexpected armed attack on U.S.S. LIBERTY (AGTR), in the Eastern Mediterranean, on 8 June 1967. Without hesitation and with complete disregard for his own personal safety he fearlessly proceeded throughout the main machinery space to check machinery and equipment to try to keep the ship going at maximum speed possible. Despite being wounded himself, his actions helped save the lives of his fellow shipmates. Chief Brooks was also awarded a Purple Heart for wounds received in action during the attack.

During his retired years, Rick continued his life of service, often speaking out about governmental efforts to hide the truth regarding the events surrounding the U.S.S. LIBERTY attack in public forums. He was close with the U.S.S. LIBERTY community and often spoke at events, reunions, and memorials for his fallen comrades.

Rick resided in North Carolina with his wife, Gloria, where they enjoyed fishing, reading, and spoiling their dogs together. Rick loved growing and tending his vegetable and flower gardens, being particularly well known for his elephant garlic, peppers, and tomatoes, as well as making fantastic salads and vinaigrettes from the bountiful harvests. His big heart and contagious laugh and generous spirit were often on display at church and community events and many charitable organizations to which he belonged. He was a devout Catholic and a member of the Knights of Columbus, VFW and American Legion. Rick's kindness was infectious and well known throughout his neighborhood community. He will be sorely missed by all those that had the privilege of meeting him.

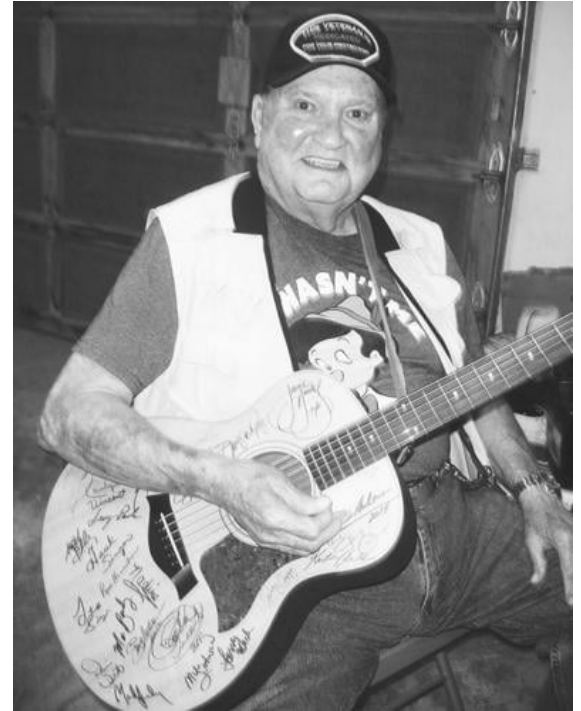
He spent 22 years serving his country in the United States Navy, followed by 17 years with the United Postal Service.

He received many medals including a Bronze Star w/ Combat "V" and a Purple Heart.

Bylaws Update from Ed Bechtel

To all Members, Friends, and Supporters of the LVA,

It has been a hectic 2023 for the LVA's Board of Directors. As you may have gathered from recent newsletters, a number of our survivors have passed away and our thoughts and prayers are with their families. Others have been dealing with illnesses requiring them to spend less time or stepping back altogether from their work on the mission that is so dear to them: seeking the acknowledgement, from our government, as to the truth of what happened on June 8, 1967.

During the 56th reunion held in Colorado Springs this year, three individuals were voted in as board members to serve their first term of 3 years including Ed Bechtel, a Liberty survivor; Miranda Internicola, great niece of Cmdr. Dave Lewis; and Dave McFarland, son of Terry McFarland. This transition is significant in that younger family members of survivors are stepping up to carry the torch. It ensures that the focus on our mission remains intact going forward.

The board is working on projects that have been long in coming. You will see the results of these efforts in the near future. It is the technological skills of our new, younger board members, and supporting associates, that have made this possible.

The LVA was incorporated in 1983 in the state of California. At that time, the LVA bylaws were created and have been in effect since. Over the years the laws of California, the preferred format of California bylaws, and the standard language used in non-profit governance have changed substantially. In reviewing these changes, it has become apparent that the administration and governance of the LVA bylaws, as originally written, are not practical and they are difficult to adhere to. Typically, a small nonprofit, such as ours, places the governance in the hands of the board of directors.

In an effort to simplify our governance structure, allow more focus on our mission, and ensure the LVA remains compliant with state and federal laws and policies, the board of directors made several changes to the bylaws. The majority of the changes are proforma and semantic in nature. However, there is one update to Articles 6.1 thru 6.4 that is substantive and we want to offer an explanation for that change.

Section 5056 of the California Corporations Code states that all "members" of the corporation, regardless of classification, shall have equal voting rights. The LVA bylaws, as originally written, extends the voting rights to all "members". This wording created an administrative nightmare and added substantial cost to administration and subsequently was not adhered to. Therefore, it was proposed by the board to reclassify "members" to "Friends of the LVA" in the new bylaws. This simple change brings the LVA in compliance with the California standard. Out of respect for the remaining survivors, a notation was made in the new bylaws (see page below) that says they shall have voting rights if in attendance at the regular meeting in June, when held. As always, a complete listing of the bylaws is available to any member upon request.

Bylaws Update from Ed Bechtel (contd.)

Article 6 MEMBERSHIPS

Section 6.1 Members

The Members/Friends of the LVA, of the corporation shall consist of the following persons:

The directors of the corporation

- a. Persons selected by the board to receive honorary membership to the LVA.
- b. Any person who served on board the USS Liberty and who has paid dues to the corporation.
- c. Any person who has paid dues to the corporation for the period coinciding with the fiscal year of the corporation to which such dues are related.
- d. Any blood relative (spouse, child, brother, sister, etc.) of a deceased USS Liberty crew member who has paid LVA dues for the period coinciding with the fiscal year.

Section 6.2 Voting Members

The members of the Corporation entitled to vote on corporate affairs shall include those persons described in subsection (a) of Article 6 Section 1. Those persons described in subsection (b) thru (e) of Article 6 section 1 are recognized as "Friends of the LVA" in lieu of "Members". The classification: "Friends of the LVA" does not carry voting rights. Voting rights are extended to persons in subsection (c) Article 6 Section 1 as described in Article 6 Section 4.

The voting members of the corporation shall be its "members within the meaning of Section 5056 of the California Corporations Code.

Section 6.3 Honorary Members

The honorary members officially recognized as, "Friends of the LVA", of the Corporation shall include those persons described in subsection (b) of Article 6 Section 1.

Section 6.4 Equal Voting Rights

All voting members as described in subsection (a) Article 6 Section 1 shall have equal voting rights in the election of board members and in other corporate affairs subject to a vote of the members. Persons described in subsection (c) Article 6 Section 1 shall have equal voting rights, if in attendance of the regular meeting only, as described in Article 6 section 9.

57th Anniversary Reunion

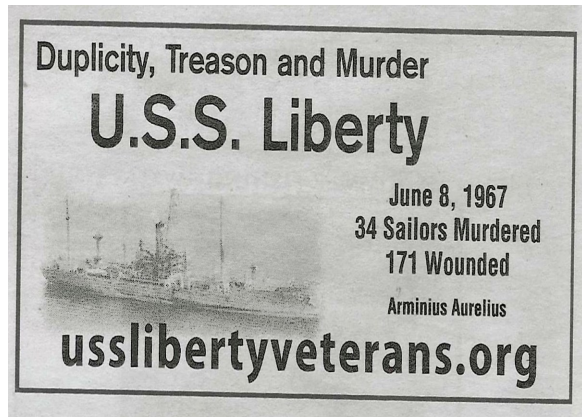

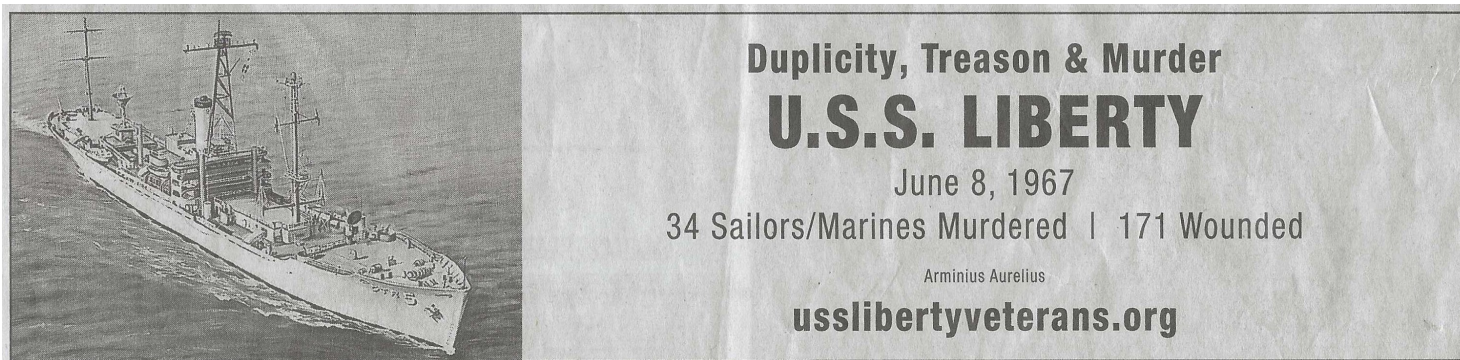
